This will give your safety professional critical information needed to determine your correct industry code and requirements for safety compliance.

### Instructions:

1. Place your mouse's pointer over any blue link below (**keep it there**)
2. At the same time, **press** and **hold** the "Ctrl" key
3. Now, **click your mouse**
4. You are now on OSHA's website Standard Industry Code
5. Find the Standard Industry Code for your business
6. Type that industry code into the space provided on your audit form
